Statement by Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield on the Deployment of the Multinational Security Support Mission to Haiti as Authorized by U.S.-Led Security Council Resolution 2699

Today marks a significant step forward for Haiti as Kenyan police forces arrived as part of the UN Security Council-authorized Multinational Security Support mission. The United States welcomes this crucial deployment authorized by U.S.-led Security Council Resolution 2699, which will bolster the Haitian National Police in their efforts to ensure safety and security for the Haitian people.

As the largest donor to the MSS, we have committed \$360 million to facilitate the mission’s success, encompassing logistics, equipment, and training.

The Haitian people deserve security and the freedom to engage in daily activities without fear—whether it’s going to work, school, or church. The MSS will play a crucial role in delivering the safety and security that Haitians rightly demand, along with sustaining political stability and promoting Haitian-led solutions for the benefit of all Haitian citizens. We commend Kenya for their leadership, without which the MSS would not be a reality.
